
















NON - ACADEMIC CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

WELFARE SERVICES CLUB



Founded in 1985, the Welfare Services Club (WSC) is a non-academic constituent club in NTU which advocates for volunteerism and provides an umbrella of volunteering activities to all students.

Currently, it runs 9 Regular Service Projects (RSPs) involved in weekly volunteering with various Social Service Organisations, 5 Special Projects (SPs) involved in planning ad-hoc volunteering and awareness events, and 5 Supporting Committees (SCs) that support the overall operations of the club. WSCs portfolios address a wide variety of social causes, serving the Elderly, Children from Low-Income Families, Children with Chronic or Terminal Illnesses, Youths-at-Risk, Persons with Mental Health Conditions, Persons with Special Needs and Persons with Disabilities. Besides growing from strength to strength in membership, WSC has also undergone incredible expansions in its activities to reach out to new groups of service users every year.

Admin & Liaison

Admin & Liaison provides adminstrative support to WSC's operations by generating and reporting statistical data and other metrics for evaluating the club's social impact. This better enables WSC to focus on and achieve our targets. We also liaise with sponsors to support WSC's volunteering activities, seeking to find new sponsors and form long-term and meaningful relationships with them.



Finance Committee

The Finance Committee manages the allocated budget from the Finance Office across all portfolios within WSC. To facilitate efficient coordination between the club and NTU, our role is paramount in making sure that the portfolios remain financially healthy at all times by monitoring expenditures, incomes and reporting any variances, enabling them to focus on and achieve their respective objectives and goals.



Growth & Opportunities (GO!)

GO! prides itself in organizing annual events for the NTU community including NTU Social impact Week and NTU WSC Exam Welfare Day. We aim to spread awareness of social causes and promote the spirit of volunteerism by supporting new causes, initiatives and collaborations outside of WSC's scope. This includes our existing green initatives such as our collaboration with Foodbank Singapore.



Internal Relations

IR aims to weave WSC together by fostering social cohesion between WSC members across all portfolios through fun and exciting bonding activities and community service. We organise large-scale bonding events including WSC Community Service Day and WSC Annual Appreciation Dinner. Prospective members can look forward to gaining greater insight into event planning and management, and building camaraderie within the IR family through different ad-hoc volunteering opportunities and our annual retreats.



Publicity and Publications

PnP provides extensive technical support for the club including professional media coverage and disseminating information about volunteering and the club's activities through publications. This includes managing the club's presence on various online and offline platforms. The divisions of PnP include Design, Digital Imaging, Journalism and Media Development.

SPECIAL PROJECTS



Camp Outreach (COR)

Camp OutReach (COR) aims to raise awareness and close the gap between the Deaf and hearing in our society. We organize empowering local events that allow them to come together to work, play and exchange ideas. We also organise the annual Overseas Community Involvement Programme (OCIP), where COR members and Singaporean Deaf volunteers come together to serve communities in need overseas. We don't help the Deaf; we empower them to help others.



Challenge Ur Limits (CURL)

CurL organises events for beneficiaries with various special needs, that challenges their mental and physcial limits. CurL also aim to reach out to people regardless of any volunteering experiences, to spark their continuous interest in serving the community. CurL organises centre visits to celebrate occasions such as Christmas and Chinese New Year, which enable service users and CurL members to interact, build rapport and understand one another better.



Ignite Change (IGC)

Ignite Change organises the annual orientation programme targeted at freshmen and existing NTU students, through exposing students to volunteerism, as well as fun and games. IGC also conducts visits in collaboration with various NTU WSC portfolios to allow volunteers to get first-hand experience of interacting with the service users. As a platform to expose potential volunteers to WSC and ignite the spirit of volunteerism in them, IGC aims to bridge a connection between our students and our service users.



OVE provides a suitable platform for passionate volunteers to continuously benefit less-privileged communities beyond geographical boundaries. Through establishing a close-knitted group of individuals, OVE aims to nurture future leaders who can think critically about prevalent social issues and creatively design solutions. To date, OVE has extended its overseas outreach to several countries in Asia, one of which is a four-year long partnership with Operation Hope Foundation as we prioritise sustainability. OVE has also collaborated with Metta Home for the Disabled and Beyond Social Services for our local volunteering outreach.



Volunteer Movement (VM)

VM aims to spread the spirit of volunteerism among students of NTU - mainly non-WSC members, through organising various interactive events with service users. By providing a readily available platform for meaningful interaction between service users and volunteers, VM hopes to ignite the passion for volunteerism amongst students, create a ripple effect to encourage students to share the joy of giving, and raise awareness and understanding of different service users.
