	1.3 Orientation Executive's Council Rally Nomination for Orientation Executive: Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi Proposer: Ms Chan Kah May Seconder: Mr Ow Jie Liang	
	1.3.1 Presentation Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi's job would be to oversee the Chairperson of Union Orientation. She was from Year 2 Business, previously from Business Information Technology during her polytechnic days. Her past leadership experiences include both orientation experiences and working experiences. She feels that she is diplomatic, a communicator and is adaptable. She feels that plans may change anytime so only by being adaptable, can she be ready for changes. Her key drivers included contribution, familiarity and growth. She has frequently stepped up in orientation camps as a Group leader, so she is not new to the role. She feels that orientation programmes are where we should start. One of the key challenges that she anticipates she would face would be the orientation scheduling and feels that there are no definite answers to this. To have innovative and effective solutions, she will have to work with all the orientation members. Her areas of focus are relationship building, inclusiveness and integrating the Union into the orientation camp. This would help to increase awareness to the new students of the school. She feels that it is important to have a long-term goal (increasing the awareness of SU) and would also like to empower individuals to step up to serve the student body.	
	 1.3.2 Question and Answer: Mr Edward Lim Xun Qian asked her approach when consulting the chairpersons. Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi felt that she must be open to their ideas and rationales. That is a chicken and egg issue and there are correct perspectives from both sides. She felt that there would always be a reason as to which camp goes first. She reiterated the need to be open without compromising on professionalism. Mr Edward Lim Xun Qian asked for her opinion on the main issues that cropped up in orientation camps. Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi felt that the need to fit the 3 big groups of orientation programmes into 3 weeks is tough and there is no turnover period. Mr Edward Lim Xun Qian asked if there is a way to increase the turnover period. Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi replied that she would seek a lot of help from the orientation chairs and the council to give a new perspective on the new issues. She must think for 	



- Mr Edward Lim Xun Qian asked how she would be splitting the workload with Welfare Executive (Student Life) (WESL).
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi would be working closely with WESL. One major highlight would be venue deconflicting and a lot of negotiation is required. However, she still requires the support and perspective of the WESL.
- Mr Koh Jia Hao Marcus mentioned that the orientation programmes are being squeezed very tightly and asked if there is any way she can push for more break time to allow the freshmen to rest. He also asked if a longer breaktime can be proposed.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi mentions that it is 2 weeks only because the official matriculation and insurance by school starts 2 weeks before school thus the camps must be fit into these 2 weeks to protect the freshmen.
- Mr Koh Jia Hao Marcus asked if the turnover period is too short and that it would cause a massive issue.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi would like to propose to extend the turnover period a little. She must also consider the perspectives of the UOCC and orientation chairs too.
- Ms Cheng Si Min asked about the arrangement of the camps being always different, and what would her stance be if she is elected.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi said that whatever she feels might not affect the schedule. It would not affect the decisions she make. Initially, she could not understand the rationale of the placement of the orientation programmes. Her mentor mentioned about inclusiveness where we think for students who are not given the opportunity to attend these camps. Thus, they are placing the most important orientation to the closest date before school starts (faculty camp). Following that, the smallest programme should go first as it is more optional, and the masses are quite small. She does not want to deny the opportunity of any freshmen for any orientation programme.
- Mr Kwok Quan Rui Desmond felt that hall camp should come first so the freshmen can have early check in and have a more proper sleeping place for the subsequent camps.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi said that if this process is implemented, it would pose a difficulty on controlling the freshmen who decide to go back to their room to stay. She feels that as seniors, they should be accountable for where the freshmen stay and know their current location. Although she cannot enforce it all the time, she will make sure that all orientation leaders can encourage their freshmen to stay in the STA.
- Mr Kwok Quan Rui Desmond felt that it doesn't make sense for hall camp to be pushed to the back due to the lack of STA.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi claimed that if majority of the students feel the same way, she would be agreeable to this solution.
- Mr Ho Qing Xuan Nigel asked how she is going to manage all 30 Orientation chairpersons under her as some of the chairpersons waited 2 weeks for a reply. He also asked about the damage that was created by some orientation groups when using the school's property.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi said that her strengths are being responsive and being on the ball. Although there are a lot of queries and ambiguity in this, there is adequate check in place to ensure TR objects are not damaged. A google form was created to check the objects due to liability issues. She felt that if she must raise an idea to counter this, it is to ask the relevant authorities to create a workshop to answer the queries and doubts of it. Ms Ashley also felt that her initial plan was to come up with google forms but doubted the feasibility of it. Thus, she confirmed that she is confident but at the same time, she can hold meetings to make sure correct info will get deployed.
- Mr Kwok Quan Rui Desmond asked about the National Day in the middle of the camps and questions if it would be disruptive.
- Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi felt that it is disruptive but to counter that, she can give them
 flexibility to choose the period. Everyone has different perspectives and in hers, she
 cannot come up with a sound solution, so she will ask the orientation leaders for ideas.

Ms Ashley Lim Xin Yi left the room for voting.
